



NGCOA Canada ‘Weather Score’

Based on the criteria below we are asking you to track or estimate your weather in order for you to post an aggregated score for the entire month.

Golf Day Weather Score Tracking Parameters

- 10** represents the absolute best golfing weather for that time of year
- 5** represents average weather for that time of year
- 0** there was no acceptable golf weather for this reporting period

Always remember to consider these factors in determining your weather score: temperature, wind, precipitation, fog, frost, humidity, flood, fire, and other natural occurrences.

All ratings outside of the 0, 5 and 10 benchmarks will be based on varying degrees of the above descriptions.

EXAMPLE

If the weather for golf at your facility for that time of year is less favourable than average, you will determine whether it’s a 1, 2, 3 or 4.

If weather conditions for golf were above average for that time of year, you would give it a score between 6-10 depending on how much better than ‘average’ you deem it to be. It’s also important to keep in mind that rain at 2:00 pm on a Monday might impact your business less than 10:00 am on the weekend.
